## First things first: Listen to your learners

Consonant sounds & Voicing

/ð/ is substituted by /d/

/w/ is not clear

/t/ at the end of a word becomes /θ/

#### What's next? Ask yourself...

Can Isabel hear the sounds?

Why does she make an approximate sound?

How can we assess this in class?

#### Moving forward with Isabel

Get physical!

Use visual clues & model it

Learn to define sounds

Give opportunities to practice & develop within and across lessons

- One thing at a time
- Listen and learn
- Step out of your teacher's shoes
- Listening needs pron
- Consistency is key
